Took highly complex facts and made them understandable by putting them in everyday language. Protected identity of source using secure communication techniques.
- Enabled FSA and Bank of England to become aware of the CDS problem without creating a further "run on the bank" through delicate, politically aware approach. Gained further credibility with input of key players including US legislator Barney Frank.
- Whilst BBC Business correspondent in Brussels built up a network of trusted contacts at the highest levels in the EU. Through these, broke the story of the 2008 summit a French Government plot to make a significant change to the European Treaty.

- Led project to identify ways to spend BBC Global News division money more effectively when the BBC knew big cuts were coming.
- Created group of senior department heads from both World Service and foreign news parts of the domestic BBC, and persuaded them to identify areas of common ground where sharing resources could improve their own programmes at no extra cost.
- Project enabled World Service editors to make their 600 strong international reporter network accessible and available to the rest of the BBC, which it had not been previously. Achieved this by linking them up with the new BBC Academy, which was able to improve the broadcast and technical skills of staff who were previously only confident to work for foreign language divisions of the World Service.
